THAILAND ORACLE UPDATES

The following amendments and corrections to the information contained in the First (January 2001) Edition of Thailand Oracle should be noted.

- General Minor variations of times and prices are not detailed here, unless the variation seems likely to cause inconvenience. Most prices have increased by about 10%, but bus fares have increased by about 25% since Thailand Oracle was published.
- Page 10, last paragraph Printing error. For serious, read series.
- Page 14, Thailand Rail Pass Cost is now Bt3,000. The pass is still good value, but one needs to plan one's time more carefully now in order to obtain optimum value from it.
- Page 14, last paragraph Air-conditioned railcars. The new railcars are made in Korea and have seats which can be rotated, so there is no longer any question of whether one is facing backwards or forwards. All passengers face in the direction in which the train is travelling.
- Page 22, Air Travel Bangkok Airways, in combination with Siemreap Airways, has introduced a *Discovery Airpass*. This allows travel to Singapore, Phuket, Samui, Hua Hin, Pattaya, Trat, Bangkok, Chiang Mai, Sukhothai, Siem Reap, Phnom Penh, Danang (Vietnam), Luang Prabang (Laos) and Jinghong (China). Cost is U.S.\$50 per domestic sector, including Siem Reap to or from Phnom Penh, or U.S.\$80 per international sector (plus taxes). A minimum of three sectors must be purchased, with a maximum of six sectors. Only one stop-over is allowed in any place.

- Page 29, Telephones One can now purchase from the telephone office a card for international calls and this can be used in any ordinary public telephone in the country if it is in working order. It may be necessary to deposit Bt1 in a public telephone in order to make the call. There are two types of card. The *Thai Card* uses ordinary telephone lines at comparatively high rates, typically about Bt30 per minute, with a 10% discount after 21:00 and on Sundays, and a 20% discount after midnight. The *Phone Net* card uses Internet lines and is 40% cheaper than the standard *Thai Card* rate. Most telephone offices also offer a quiet booth from which a call can be made, but only during opening hours.
- Page 30, E-mail Now the Telephone Office Internet cards are inserted into the computer. Post Offices often have terminals too, but not all of them work.
- Page 31, Banks and Money Currently U.S.\$1 = Bt40 approximately. £1 = Bt70 approximately. \$A1 = Bt30 approximately. Bt10 notes are disappearing from circulation. A new design of Bt20 note has been introduced, similar to the higher value notes and still green. A plastic Bt50 note is now in circulation.
- Pages 39 40, Bangkok, From the Airport Air-conditioned buses in Bangkok have been renumbered to avoid confusion with the numbers of ordinary buses. Most of the air-conditioned buses now have numbers in the 500s. At the top of page 40, the air-conditioned bus running from the airport to Silom Road is now no. 504 and the air-conditioned bus to Sukhumvit Road is now no. 513.
- Page 42, paragraph 2 Travel between Don Muang and Hualampong is now permitted on rapid or express trains for Bt10 3rd class.
- Page 44, Ordinary buses Bangkok's ordinary buses are gradually changing from a flat fare of Bt3.50 to one of Bt5. Only the red and cream buses still charge Bt3.50.
- Page 44, Air-conditioned buses The problem with air-conditioned bus numbers has now been resolved. Most air-conditioned buses bear new numbers in the 500s. In most cases the new number is just the old number plus 500. Thus the old air-conditioned 4 is now the 504. However, there are some routes where there was no confusion which have retained their old numbers. There are also routes where both ordinary and air-conditioned buses operate using the same number.
- Page 46, The Sky Train A one-day ticket is now available for Bt100. A three-day ticket costs Bt280. (Thanks to Debra & Steven Kennedy of Perth, Australia for the information.)
- Page 53, Sukhumvit Road Map The air-conditioned buses running along Sukhumvit Road are now numbered 501, 508, 511, 513.
- Page 55, Grand Palace Transport From Sukhumvit Road air-conditioned nos. 501 or 508. From Hualampong air-conditioned nos. 501 or 507.
- Pages 55 63, Transport to various attractions To most air-conditioned bus numbers add 500.
- Page 59, Wat Ratchanatdaram Bus 44 still operates but is now only an ordinary bus, not an air-conditioned service.

Page 68, Bangkok (Hualampong) Railway Station - Note that the advance booking office closes at 16:00. After this time, advance reservations can be made at certain of the ordinary booking windows. There is now also a window devoted to reservations and tickets for foreign visitors.

Page 69, Thonburi Railway Station - For some reason which the author has yet to discover, Thonburi Station building has been closed and the terminus has been moved about a kilometre up the track. This is rather an inconvenience. If you take the ferry, you must walk the kilometre or take a taxi or tuk-tuk. Bus no. 40 from Sukhumvit Road via Hualampong Station also passes about a kilometre from the new terminus. When the bus turns left into Phran Nok Road get off and walk along Arun Amarin Road in the direction in which the bus was travelling before it turned. Alternatively, stay on board the no. 40 until it turns right and get off when it crosses the railway tracks. There is a small station here, the first halt out of Thonburi, and all trains stop to pick up passengers.

Page 72, Youth Hostel - Printing error. The bus from Hualampong is no. 53, not no. 52.

Pages 75-78, *Buses* - Bus fares have increased since the book was printed. The rate of increase varies, but allow for approximately 25% more than the rates shown. Roads are gradually being improved, leading to some reductions in journey times.

Page 80, line 17 - Apex Hotel now starts at Bt450. Breakfast Bt90. Dinner Bt150.

Page 80, line 19 - Skaw (pronounced 'Sakau') Beach Hotel Bt490.

Page 80, line 29 - These air-conditioned buses are now numbered 510 and 513.

Page 80, line 35 - Air-conditioned bus to Ekkamai is now no. 513.

Page 80, last paragraph - Note carefully that this train now operates only on Mondays to Fridays. Arrival time is 10:31.

Page 81, at foot - Train fare is currently Bt31.

Page 87, line 16 - Train arrival time in Bangkok is now 18:10.

Page 87, Further Down the Coast, line 3 - Printing error. For XXX, read 77.

Page 92, lines 4 and 8 - Printing error. For Mae Pamphung, read Mae Ramphung (if not already corrected by hand in your copy).

Page 102, map - Printing error. For Nam Tok Phieu, read Nam Tok Phliu.Page 116, railway timetable from Aranyaprathet and other eastern locations to Bangkok.

Page 130, Surin - The rapid train now leaves Bangkok at 6:40 and reaches Buriram at 14:38.

Page 134, Ubon Ratchathani - The rapid train now leaves Bangkok at 6:40 and arrives at 18:20.

Page 134, Ubon Ratchathani buses - All of the city bus routes have been taken over by *songtaew*. However routes remain as shown on the map on page 135 and the fare remains Bt5.

Page 148, Nong Khai - The rapid trains now leave from Bang Sue station in Bangkok, not from Hualampong. Bang Sue is about 25 minutes north of Hualampong by ordinary train. Departures from Bang Sue are at 6:15, with arrival at Nong Kai scheduled for 17:30, and at 18:55 with arrival at Nong Khai scheduled for 7:20. The night express, bearing sleeping accommodation, leave Bangkok (Hualampong) at 20:45 and reaches Nong Khai at 8:55. Rapid trains from Nong Khai to Bangkok also terminate at Bang Sue.

Page 151, Nong Khai map - The railway station has been moved back along the line to the south, so that it now lies just to the south of the road running east into the town towards hotel 17. This puts it even further away, a walk of over three kilometres. It is still within possible walking distance of the bridge, but it is better to invest Bt5 for a *songtaew* or *samlor*. To go into town, take a bus no. 4326, which also costs Bt5. All trains terminate at the new station except the 6:15 from Nakhon Ratchasima arriving at 12:45. This continues to the old station, arriving at 12:50. It then leaves again at 12:55 and departs from the new station at 13:00 for its return journey to Nakhon Ratchasima.

Page 153, railway timetable from Nong Khai to Bangkok.

Page 153, Udon Thani - See amendment above (page 148) regarding departure point for rapid trains from Bangkok.

Page 158, Khon Kaen - Again note that rapid trains from and to Bangkok commence from and terminate at Bang Sue station, not Hualampong.

Page 165, lower map - Wat Po Nok Kaba is 26 kilometres from Sang Khom.

Page 177, Ayutthaya - Travel between Bangkok and Ayutthaya is now permitted on rapid or express trains for Bt20 3rd class.

Page 184, Lopburi - The Den Chai train now leaves Bangkok (Hualampong) at 7:00 and reaches Lopburi at 10:00, but the Phitsanulok train no longer starts from Hualampong. It can be picked up at Bang Khen, about 40 minutes north of Hualampong, at 9:17, or at Don Muang airport station at 9:32. It reaches Lopburi at 12:00. The railcar, now a special express, leaves Bangkok (Hualampong) at 8:30 and reaches Lopburi at 10:45.

Page 189, paragraph 3 - The rapid train now leaves Bangkok at 6:20, arriving in Phitsanulok at 13:27. The ordinary train mentioned no longer starts from Hualampong (see amendment immediately above), but there is an ordinary train leaving Hualampong at 7:00 and reaching Phitsanulok at 15:17. The railcar is now a special express, leaving Bangkok at 8:30 and arriving in Phitsanulok at 13:55.

- Page 190, line 8 Sadly, the night market has been moved away from the bank of the river. It is now to be found to the north-west of the railway station, near the Sivathep Hotel (see map on page 191).
- Page 192, paragraph before last The Telephone Office now seems to close at 18:00.
- Page 193, Moving On Ordinary train to Chiang Mai. Phitsanulok 7:32. Chiang Mai 15:50.
- Page 198, Sri Satchanalai, paragraph 4 Direct train to Sawan Kalok now leaves Bangkok at 9:30 and arrives at Sawan Kalok at 16:30. Departs Sawan Kalok at 16:50 and arrives in Bangkok at 23:45.
- Page 200, Moving On Note new times for the Bangkok train, as immediately above. The train to Uttaradit and Sila At now leaves at 14:30.
- Page 201, Uttaradit, paragraph 2 Times of trains to Chiang Mai have changed slightly. Rapid departs Uttaradit at 6:07 and arrives in Chiang Mai at 11:50. Ordinary train departs Uttaradit at 9:26 and arrives in Chiang Mai at 15:50. Air-conditioned railcar departs Uttaradit at 15:00 and arrives in Chiang Mai at 19:45.
- Page 209, Lampang, paragraph 2 Train times mentioned should be amended to the following. Special express railcar departs Bangkok at 8:30, arrives in Lampang at 17:44. Special express railcar departs Bangkok at 19:25, arrives in Lampang at 5:10. Rapid departs Bangkok at 6:20, arrives in Lampang at 18:52.
- Page 212, Chiang Mai, paragraph 2 Train times mentioned should be amended to the following. Special express railcar departs Bangkok at 8:30, arrives in Chiang Mai at 19:45. Special express railcar departs Bangkok at 19:25, arrives in Chiang Mai at 7:20. Rapid departs Bangkok at 6:20, arrives in Chiang Mai at 20:55.
- Page 212, paragraph 3 There is an accommodation information counter at the railway station and, in many cases, free transport is offered to your choice of accommodation. This counter is usually open for the arrival of the higher class trains, but not necessarily for the slower ones.
- Page 213, last paragraph Wat Chedi Luang now also operates an activity named 'Monk Chat'. Visitors are invited to talk to English-speaking monks about their lives, about the Buddhist religion, or about anything else which attracts their curiosity.
- Page 218, Doi Suthep Current fare to Doi Suthep is Bt40 up and Bt30 down.

- Page 257, Kanchanaburi Note that Thonburi Station has been moved back about one kilometre from the river. See amendment to page 69.
- Page 261, last sentence Amazingly, after half a century of talking, the railway line actually has been extended to the waterfall now (Nam Tok Sai Yok Noi Station). However, only the midday train uses this section of track, and even that train goes only at weekends at present, although it may soon be extended every day. When it terminates at Nam Tok, one can at least walk to the waterfall along the railway line now.
- Page 262, paragraph 6 Hell Fire Pass. The walking track has now been extended and one can cover four kilometres of the old railway line. There are informative signs along the way and steps have been built in places where there were originally bridges and viaducts. One has to return by the same route. A further four kilometres of track is being cleared and it is already possible to walk this section too, although no improvements have yet been made beyond clearing the undergrowth. If you attempt any of this interesting walk, remember to take plenty of water, and also insect repellent as there are plenty of mosquitoes. Watch out for snakes too. On request, the museum will lend you a radio transmitter for emergencies. The bus fare from Kanchanaburi is now Bt35 (or Bt15 from Nam Tok).
- Page 264, paragraph 1 At present, only unofficial day trips into Myanmar are being permitted at the Three Pagodas Pass. This means that passports will not be stamped and no extra stay will be granted upon return to Thailand. However, the situation changes periodically, so enquire locally, but do not rely upon this as a means of extending a stay in Thailand.
- Page 264, paragraph 2 It seems as though the two air-conditioned buses from Kanchanaburi to Three Pagodas Pass are no longer operating, so it will be necessary to take a *songtaew* from Sangklaburi to the border.

- Page 264, paragraph 3 Unfortunately, there is now an entrance fee of Bt200 for the Erawan National Park.
- Page 264, Kanchanaburi, Tigers A relatively new but increasingly popular attraction near Kanchanaburi is the tigers being kept at Wat Thamsuadad. These tigers, together with some other animals, have been rescued from captivity, usually as pets. They cannot be returned to the wild, but are being given as pleasant a lifestyle as possible by the monks here. These are free-range tigers, and one takes one's own risk, but not too many visitors fail to return. Feeding time is mid-afternoon. Wat Thamsuadad is about 30 kilometres north of Kanchanaburi and is reached by bus no. 8203 at a cost of Bt15. Upon alighting, one has to walk two kilometres to the left of the main road to reach the monastery.

- Page 268, Moving On, paragraph 1 Train to Thonburi now leaves at 6:57, reaching Thonburi at 10:45. Other trains at 12:03 (Thonburi 16:10) and 14:36 (Bang Sue 18:45, Sam Sen 18:54, Makkasan 19:12). Ordinary train to Chumphon and Lang Suan at 11:11. Rapid train to Haad Yai and Yala at 19:36.

Second class seats may be reserved at any time and then converted into first class seats, subject to availability, 24 hours prior to departure. Sleeping berth charges are not included in the pass, but '2+' ('dua plus') sleepers may be used free, if available, by first class ticket holders. There are '2+' sleepers on the night trains to Kuala Lumpur.
